Artist Note

This project was inspired by an ice skating performance of Pierrot & Columbine I saw on television when my daughter Shannon was aspiring to be a professional ice skater. I created her child like loveliness with the solitude of Pierrot because ice-skating is such a lonely sport.

Materials:

Matisse Winter Blue. **Background Effect:**

Wood graining tool.

BRUSHES

#2 round #4 Neef Smooshing brush Micron Pen 08 black #4 filbert #000 short liner

Preparation:

- 1. Base coat in Winter Blue
- 2. Mix Marbelling Gel with equal parts of Antique White & Pearl White.
- 3. With the base coating brush, paint on the above mix to the stool top.
- 4. Using the Wood graining tool, create the grains you desire on the top of the stool.
- 5. If you slip up simply paint the graining out & begin again with a clean tool.
- 6. Leave to dry thoroughly.
- 7. Transfer the design to the stool.

Blocking In

- 8. Block in both the face & hand in Unbleached Titanium.
- 9. Block in the pants, tunic, stocking, ruffles & hat in Antique White.
- 10. Do the balloons in Antique White.
- 11. Place the pattern over the work & transfer the diamond design back onto the tunic.
- 12. Block the hair in Yellow Oxide.
- 13. The shoe is done in Carbon Black.
- 14. The diamonds & balloons are blocked in with the following colours. Aqua Green Light, Powder Blue, Magenta Light + Cad Red Medium + Titanium White (2:1:2), Permanent Light Violet, Naples Yellow
- 15. All Pom-poms are blocked in with Diox Purple.
- 16. Block the nose in with Magenta Light + Cad Red Medum (2:1).

The Project

Line Work:

- 17. Using the Micron Pen, line in the diamonds.
- 18. Line in the stripes on the sock & bow.

Face:

- 19. Using a moist smoosher & Raw Umber paint into the shadows & hollows on the face. Blend into Unbleached Titanium as you paint toward the high points of the face.
- 20. Begin at the edge beneath the hair from one side of the face to the other.
- 21. Continue beneath the eye brows.
- 22. Now shade down the left side of the nose & down the left side of the face to the chin.

- 23. Shade under the nose. Do this carefully as you can easily end up with a "moustache".
- 24. Using Antique White & the moist smoosher, paint in the highlights on the right side cheek & down the right side of the nose. There should still be a little Unbleached Titanium showing down the centre of the nose.
- 25. Add a small amount of highlighting on the chin.
- 26. Add a dash of Titanium White to Magenta Light + Cad Red Medium mix & paint in her lips using the #000 short liner.
- 27. With the same mix highlight the topside of the nose with a coma stroke from about 11 o'clock to about 4 o'clock.
- 28. With Titanium White do a stroke over the top of the nose to represent a "shine".
- 29. Paint in a dividing line between the lips with Raw Umber.
- 30. Do a small stroke along the bottom lip.
- 31. Paint in the eyes with Antique White.
- 32. Thin Payne's Grey & line around the eyes taking care to keep the shapes accurate.
- 33. Paint in the irises with Powder Blue. Ensure that they are of equal size.
- 34. The pupils are done in Carbon Black. Keep both the same size, round & in the middle of each iris. You don't want her cross eyed!
- 35. Line across the top eyelid in Carbon Black.
- 36. With a wash of Payne's Grey, do the shadow on the eye, just under the lid from tail to tear duct.
- 37. Do a dot of white on each iris using the point of the #000 short liner.
- 38. Line along the bottom lid in Raw Umber
- 39. Do the eyebrows in Raw Umber using the liner brush, go easy here, this isn't Groucho Marks you're painting.
- 40. The diamond on her cheek is painted in Aqua Green Light using either the liner brush or the #2 round.
- 41. The eye make up markings are painted Carbon Black with a dash of white added to take the harshness off black.

Hair:

- 42. Shade the underside of the hair in Raw Umber with the #2 round.
- 43. Stroke from each ear to ear under the fringe & into the ears creating earholes.
- 44. Highlights are done in Turners Yellow

Tunic:

45. With Payne's Grey, using the dagger brush float in the shading on the tunic beginning under the ruffle.

- 46. Follow the contours of the ruffle from shoulder to shoulder.
- 47. Float in a knife shape stroke (lifting the brush off at the end of each stroke), thus creating the gathers in the fabric
- 48. Float at the cuff in the same way but shorter strokes.
- 49. Float under each pom pom.

Pom Poms:

- 50. With the smoosher, add white to Diox Purple, load both colours generously onto the brush but don't mix.
- 51. Dab generously to the topside of each pom pom, adding Diox Purple to the dirty brush as you move down each pom pom.

Pants:

- 52. Using Payne's Grey floated as for the tunic shading, float in the shadows on the undersides of the legs.
- 53. Stroke from the edge in slightly to create folds & creases in the fabric.
- 54. At the cuff edge, stroke up into the leg to give the appearance of gathering.
- 55. Line around the ankle using the Micron pen.

Ruffles:

- 56. Continuing with Payne's Grey as above, float from the neck edge outwards, radiating around the ruffle evenly. Turn the work around if it makes it easier.
- 57. A few strokes only are required on the cuff ruffle.
- 58. Shade the underside layers now of the ruffle using the point of the dagger brush.
- 59. Edge the ruffles with the Micron pen. Line around the neck & wrist too.

Hat:

- 60. Float down the left side with the Payne's Grey. **Sock**:
- 61. Float Raw Umber onto the underside of the sock.

Hand

62. Using Raw Umber as a wash, using the #000 short liner, shade the hand under the cuff & down the left side of each finger.

Bow on balloons:

- 63. The stripes on the bow are achieved by using the Micron pen.
- 64. When this is dry shade from the centres of the bow in a wash of Payne's Grey using the #000 liner.
- 65. On the 2 loops work from the centre knot outwards.
- 66. On the tails work from the underside of the centre knot.

Shadows:

67. With this same wash, float beneath the clown (creating a floor)in horizontal strokes. This will give her the appearance of the clown sitting on something rather than floating in space.

Balloons.

- 68. With the #2 round brush, commence on the underside of the balloon in the first colour listed below.
- 69. Use long sweeping strokes around the curve of the balloon.
- 70. Do 2 or 3 strokes.
- 71. With the dirty brush, load on a little white & blend into the last stroke continuing to sweep further into the balloon.
- 72. Keep on adding white as you progress.
- 73. Wash & dry brush.
- 74. Load with white & dry brush a stroke of white across the top left as seen in the picture.
- 75. Repeat the above steps for all the other balloons using all the colours of the balloons listed.
 - 1st colour- Powder Blue. Add Titanium White.
 - 1st colour- Diox Purple. Add Permanent Light

- Violet. Then add Titanium White.
- 1st colour- Aqua Green Light. Add Titanium White.
- 1st colour- Payne's Grey. Add Antique White.
- 1st colour- Turners Yellow. Add Naples Yellow. Then add Titanium White.
- 1st colour- Magenta Light + Cad Red mix.
 Add Titanium White.

Glazing:


76. Glaze over the stool top in Iridescent Violet made from Brilliant Alizarine + Ultramarine Blue + Matisse Iridescent Medium (2:1:2) using your varnishing brush.
